2012 Pavement Management Project To Begin By May

Golden Valley's 2012 Pavement Management Project will focus on three different areas in the City (see maps below) and will reconstruct 1.9 miles of City streets to City standards, including concrete curb and gutter. Work by private utility companies (gas, telephone, television, electrical), necessary repairs to public utilities (sanitary sewer, water, and storm sewer), and street construction will occur in separate phases. Work is expected to start in late April or May.

What Will Be Impacted Near My Home?

The area impacted by construction activities will be larger than where the existing street is. This may include areas near the street, such as driveways and vegetation. Some driveways may have a partial section

removed and temporarily patched with gravel while construction takes place.

Boulevard areas in the right-of-way may be disturbed by equipment or used to store construction material. Any areas disturbed by construction activities will be restored by the end of the project.

Please note that irrigation lines and buried pet fences (Invisible Fences) are the responsibility of the property owner and need to be removed from the construction area before construction begins.




What Should I Do To Prepare?

During construction, parking on the street may be restricted and access to your driveway delayed. If you are planning home improvement projects, hosting events, or other activities that may involve a large number of people coming to your home, make sure there is adequate off-street parking and consider that daily construction activities may cause additional delays.

If you have plants or other vegetation near the street that you do not want impacted by construction, please move them before the work begins. Any plant vegetation left within the right-of-way may be adversely affected by construction activities.

Residents in the 2012 PMP area may have their sanitary sewer service inspected as part of the project. This inspection is part of the City's ongoing Inflow and Infiltration (I/I) Reduction Program. To participate in the program, call Public Works at 763-593-8030 to schedule an inspection. If you schedule an inspection before May 5, you can avoid the normal \$250 inspection fee.

Sewer service inspections are voluntary (unless you are selling your home). Additional information can be found on the City's website at www.goldenvalleymn.gov (click on "Inflow and Infiltration" in the Quick Links box on the homepage).

SCHEDULES MAY CHANGE ON SHORT NOTICE Weather, delays by subcontractors, or other unforeseen events can cause schedule changes. The contractor makes an effort to notify residents as soon as possible.

CHECK DOORS FOR NOTICES The contractor will routinely notify you about upcoming work, particularly if the work will make your driveway inaccessible for most or part of a day (you will be able to get back into your driveway each evening). Please check all of the doors around your house for written notices of upcoming work.

RECYCLING Recycling should be picked up as scheduled. Please continue to have your recycling curbside by 7 am on Fridays of your service week. The recycling contractor will collect recycling in street reconstruction areas on schedule. Please continue to report all missed pick-ups to Allied Waste at 952-941-5174.
