Utility Work On Perry Ave Cul-De-Sac Is Completed, Gravel Installation Up Next

Water, storm, and sanitary sewer work on the Perry Ave cul-de-sac has been completed. Crews will begin to place gravel and install curb and gutter in the next two weeks.

City staff will be on site monitoring work on Perry Ave, but residents with construction questions should call Golden Valley Public Works at 763-593-8030.

CenterPoint Restoring Yard Damage

CenterPoint Energy crews have started to restore yards damaged during gas main installation.

Damaged yards will be restored from approximately 5 feet from the street towards

the house. The remaining portion along the street will be restored after street work has been completed later this summer.

Yosemite Park And Upcoming Projects

Construction in the Yosemite Park area is scheduled to begin the week of June 10.

Crews will begin by reclaiming streets (Loring Lane, Woodstock Ave, and the east portion of Yosemite Circle) that week. Utility work will also begin. ○

Understanding Paint Markings And Flags

From time to time the City receives calls from residents asking about colored flags and markings in their yard, in the boulevard, or on the street. These markings represent the general location of existing utilities and are critical to minimizing potential construction impacts to these utilities.

How to decode paint markings and flags:

Blue = water

Green = sanitary and storm sewer

Red = electric

Orange = communications (telephone fiber-optic and cable TV)

Yellow = gas

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Please Remove Irrigation Systems And Invisible Fencing Now

Many homeowners have installed irrigation systems and/or invisible fencing adjacent to the street. Because these private irrigation and fence systems are within City street right-of-way, they are in the path of the reconstruction project and must be moved.

To avoid spending tax dollars to relocate private irrigation and fence systems, homeowners are responsible for temporarily moving or relocating their own systems. This work should be taken care of before crews start working on your street.

The Public Works staff suggests that you remove sprinkler heads and plug lines that are located within 15 feet of the existing street and pull the pipe ends up so they can be easily seen. You will still be responsible for repairing any irrigation or fencing systems you have placed in the right-of-way, but these suggestions will minimize costs for replacing the systems later on.

SCHEDULES MAY CHANGE ON SHORT NOTICE Weather, delays by subcontractors, or other unforeseen events can cause schedule changes. The contractor makes an effort to notify residents as soon as possible for situations where utility or driveway access restrictions may be experienced.

CHECK DOORS FOR NOTICES The contractor will routinely notify you about upcoming work, particularly if the work will make your driveway inaccessible for most or part of a day (you will be able to get back into your driveway each evening). Please check all of the doors around your house for written notices of upcoming work.

CONSTRUCTION QUESTIONS At the construction site, please direct all project-related questions to City staff. RECYCLING Recycling should be picked up as scheduled. Please continue to have your recycling curbside by 7 am on Fridays of your service week. The recycling contractor will collect recycling in street reconstruction areas on schedule. Please continue to report all missed pick-ups to Allied Waste at 952-941-5174.
