Utility Work Continues; Construction Set To Begin April 27

This year's PMP project will reconstruct 0.8 miles of streets east of Lakeview Park, and the contractor is GMH Asphalt Corporation. Weather permitting, the City portion of the project is set to begin the week of April 27.

This week CenterPoint Energy completed its replacement of the existing gas main and started installation of new gas services to properties. If you have questions about CenterPoint Energy's project, please call 612-321-5369.

Depending on the weather and progress made by CenterPoint Energy, GMH Asphalt crews will begin by lowering manholes and water valves, reclaiming the existing asphalt, and setting up a temporary water system on Gettysburg Avenue.

Residents who have irrigation systems, invisible dog fences, and perennial flowers in the City rights-of-way need to move them now to avoid any damage from the construction. (see article below).

Please Move Irrigation Systems, Invisible Fences

Some homeowners have installed irrigation systems and/or invisible fencing adjacent to the street.

Because these private structures are within City right-of-way, they are in the path of the reconstruction project and must be moved.

To avoid spending tax dollars to relocate private irrigation and fence systems, home-

owners are responsible for temporarily moving or relocating their own systems.

This work should be completed before construction work starts. If you have any questions, please contact Public Works at 763-593-8030.

Residents May Request Driveway Estimates

If your driveway connects with one of the reconstructed streets and a portion of it will be removed to properly perform construction, you may take part in the City's driveway program.

The City of Golden Valley pays to replace that portion of your driveway with the same material that was removed. But you have the opportunity to reconstruct the rest of your driveway (blacktop or concrete) as part of the project at the same prices paid by the City, plus an administrative fee.

If you choose to do this, you can pay in cash after construction to avoid having it assessed, or you can have the costs assessed to your property over 10 years with the associated interest charges.

If you are interested in replacing your driveway as part of the City's street reconstruction project, call Public Works at 763-593-8030 to request a driveway estimate. ○

How To Prepare For And What To Expect From This Construction Season

Construction activities will have an impact on more than just the street. For example, some driveways may have a partial section removed and temporarily patched with gravel while construction takes place. Also, boulevard areas in the right-of-way may be disturbed by equipment or used to store construction material. All areas disturbed by construction activities will be restored by the end of the project.

Move Items From The ROW

If you have plants, vegetation, irrigation lines, or buried pet fences (invisible fences) near the street that you do not want damaged by construction, please move them before work begins.

Schedule A Sanitary Sewer Inspection

Residents in the PMP area may have their sanitary sewer service inspected as part of the project and the City's ongoing Inflow and Infiltration (I/I) Reduction Program. If you schedule an inspection before May 1, you do not have to pay the normal \$250 inspection fee. Call Public Works at 763-593-8030.

Plan For Parking And Access Disruptions

During construction, parking on the street may be restricted and access to your driveway delayed. If you are planning home improvement projects or will host events or other activities that may involve a large

number of people coming to your home, make sure there is adequate off-street parking and consider that daily construction activities may cause additional delays or limited access.

SCHEDULES MAY CHANGE ON SHORT NOTICE Weather, delays by subcontractors, or other unforeseen events can cause schedule changes. The contractor makes an effort to notify residents as soon as possible for situations where utility or driveway access restrictions may be experienced.

CHECK DOORS FOR NOTICES The contractor will routinely notify you about upcoming work, particularly if the work will make your driveway inaccessible for most or part of a day (you will be able to get back into your driveway each evening). Please check all of the doors around your house for written notices of upcoming work.

CONSTRUCTION QUESTIONS At the construction site, please direct all project-related questions to City staff. RECYCLING Recycling should be picked up as scheduled. Please continue to have your recycling curbside by 7 am on Fridays of your service week.
