Golden Valley Community Service Commission Fund Allocations

Since the GVHSC's inception (now the CSC), \$2,097,002 has been allocated to agencies. For 2026, the Golden Valley Community Service Commission allocated \$50,000 to eight local human service organizations: CEAP—Northwest Suburban Dinner at Your Door (\$10,000), Damascus Way (\$3,000), Greater Minneapolis Crisis Nursery (\$3,000), HUG (\$3,000), PRISM (\$20,000), Senior Community Services Outreach (\$5,000), Sojourner Project (\$3,000), The Bridge For Youth (\$3,000).

CEAP Meals On Wheels delivers hot, nourishing lunches to seniors and individuals who cannot easily prepare meals or leave their homes. They serve more than 68 Golden Valley seniors with five hot meals per week to help them maintain independence, dignity, and health. They also provide a stable, regular point of contact, connecting our seniors with the broader community and its resources.

For more than 45 years, Damascus Way has served substance use recovery and prison re-entry populations with housing and meals, peer to peer training and recovery support services, employment coaching, personal advocacy, community engagement, and community integration support. From its key housing facilities in Golden Valley, Damascus Way serves demographics from several counties in the greater Twin Cities area.

Greater Minneapolis Crisis Nursery

The Crisis Nursery focuses on prevention by offering free, voluntary services for parents who face barriers such as unemployment, homelessness, medical or mental health concerns, poverty, domestic violence, or other situations. They help strengthen families by connecting them to resources, caring for their children during difficult times, and setting goals that promote stability and strong parent/child relationships.
