

# Team/Player Conduct

Players must be at least 18 years of age to participate in this league.

The City of Golden Valley is NOT RESPONSIBLE for lost or stolen items.

Teams must show up for games on time. If there is a need to forfeit, teams must contact both the league director and manager of the team they are scheduled to play by 3 pm on the day of the game.

Only rostered players are allowed. Players who are not listed on your team's roster are considered illegal players. Players can be added to your roster as long as it does not exceed the player limit.

Abusing officials, and city staff will not be tolerated. There is a difference between discussing a call and verbal abuse.

Any player/manager ejected from a game will receive an automatic one game suspension. The league director will review each situation to determine if further action is required. Repeated offenses in a season will result in a suspension for the remainder of the season.

Physical altercations will result in immediate ejection and suspension from league play for all individuals involved, as determined by the league director. Verbal confrontations will be reviewed and appropriate disciplinary action will be issued on an incident by incident basis.

# League Rules

Teams shall consist of six players, three females/ three males, however a team of four females/ two males is acceptable. A team may legally play with as few as four players (two males/two females). If a team has less than four legal players for any reason, the match will be a forfeit. If a additional players arrives after a match started, players can enter the match as they arrive.

Males and females must alternate positions. If the ball is hit more than once on a side, one touch must be by a female.

Substitutions must take place only when the ball is dead, and if the team is not rotating players. If desired, an eight-player rotation can be used where two players rotate off the court and are not allowed to participate until rotating back on.

Three games will be played during each match. It is not a best of three.

25 points wins the game provided there is a two point lead with a 27 point cap.

Games begin promptly at assigned times and are played with a one hour time limit. This includes warm up and playing time. Games will be completed at the time limit, and victory can be decided by one point.

15 minutes—2nd game forfeit

20 minutes—3rd game forfeit

*\*The score recorded for a forfeited game is 25-0\**

Teams must supply a ball for warm ups prior to the match. Games may be played with a provided game ball or another agreed upon ball.

# League Rules Continued...

For the first game of the match, the home team has the choice to take the serve or choice of side. The team not serving the first game shall serve the second game. The team not serving the second game shall serve the third game. Teams shall change sides at the end of each game.

At the beginning of each game, the team serving shall NOT rotate. After the team first serving has lost the serve, their opponent **SHALL** rotate for their first serve. Teams rotate clockwise.

Before the serve, the server must announce the score of the game for both teams to hear.

Blocking the serve is not allowed.

Contact with the net by a player is not a fault, unless it interferes with the play. It is legal for a player to have one foot cross the center line **without interfering with a play.**

It is legal to contact the ball with any part of the body as long as it does not visibly come to rest. Balls can be played with the feet, knees or any other part of the body below the knees.

A ball which touches a boundary line is in bounds.

Successive plays of the ball by a player whose first play is an attempt to block shall be permitted. The next play shall count as the first of three hits allowed this player's team.

If two players contact the ball simultaneously, it counts as one hit and either may play the ball.

A spiker must contact the ball on his/her own side of the net, but may in the course of his/her follow through cross over (but not touch) the net.

# Weather Cancellations

In the event of inclement weather on the day of the game the league director will determine if the games are to be played no later than 4 pm. League updates and game cancellations will be placed on the Activity Cancellation Line at 763-512-2350.

Make-up games will be added on to the schedule at end of the regular season.
